## A Message from the Rector: New Life in Christ

**S**ince Eastertide extends through the month of May, more consideration of the Lord Jesus Christ's resurrection and the resurrection of the faithful will enhance our understanding of the new life brought into the world by His resurrection. Just as by faith in the Lord Jesus Christ Christians are identified with Christ in His death, so by the same faith, they walk in the newness of Christ's life and share in His resurrection (*Romans 6:4-8*). This identification with Christ effected by our faith in Him and signified by the Sacrament of Holy Baptism and re-affirmed at Confirmation implies a very close connection with the Lord. St. Paul indicates this elsewhere in these words, which could have been a very early hymn of the Church:

It is a faithful saying: For if we be dead with Him, we shall also live with Him: If we suffer, we shall also reign with Him: If we deny Him, He also will


Him show loyal love for Christ, whereas denying Him and refusing to continue to believe show apostasy. Even when Christians turn away from their faith, the Lord remains faithful since He cannot deny Himself. But Christians who remain faithful to their Lord, showing their love through obedience to Him (*St. John 14:15*), will also live with Him and reign with Him in God's eternal kingdom.

Even Ruth in Old Testament times set an example of loyal love in the reply she gave her mother-in-law Naomi when Naomi suggested that she return to her people and her gods:

deny us: If we believe not, yet He abideth faithful: He cannot deny Himself.  
*II St. Timothy 2:11-13, KJV*

lodge: thy people shall be my people, and thy God my God: Where thou diest, will I die, and there will I be buried: the LORD do so to me, and more also, if ought but death part thee and me.

**Ruth**

1:16-  
17, KJV

Ruth's loyal love for Naomi meant that she identified with Naomi in her distress. By gleaning grain in the fields of Naomi's relative, Boaz, Ruth found new life and married her kinsman-redeemer,

Boaz (who, in purchasing the property of Naomi's dead husband Elimelech, had to marry Elimelech's daughter Ruth to raise up descendants for Elimelech according to the laws of Levirate marriage – **Ruth 4:10**). Ruth received a new life as Boaz's wife and received a new inheritance; she gave birth to Obed, who became the father of Jesse and grandfather of King David.

Our love for Christ must be the same loyal

love which never abandons or deserts our faith. Let us see how the Apostles were transformed by the love of the Lord Jesus Christ and the power of His resurrection. **St. Mark 14:50** records that all the disciples forsook Jesus and fled when He was arrested. Now the resurrection appearances of the Lord Jesus Christ had the

make disciples of people of all nations (**St. John 20:21**; **St. Matthew 28:18-20**). These disciples received the power of the Holy Spirit to proclaim the Gospel boldly. They had seen and known the risen Christ and shared in His new life.

However, the Lord, in His reply to St. Thomas's confession of faith,

pronounces a blessing on all who have not seen Him and yet believe (**St. John 20:29b**). Most Christians who have ever believed in Christ have never seen Him in His risen state; most Christians, then, receive this blessing from the

effect of uniting and strengthening the disciples, and after the Ascension, they continued in prayer and worship together. Their faith had been revitalized and their loyalty to Christ renewed! They received the peace of God when He showed Himself to them in His risen body (**St. John 20:19, 21**). These disciples were the eyewitnesses of Jesus' resurrection, whom He sent on a mission to all nations to preach the Gospel and

Lord, the blessing of having believed in Him without having seen Him. Does this mean that we are doomed to share the Gospel less effectively than the Apostles did? Surely not! For the same Holy Spirit whom the disciples received from Jesus lives in every Christian now. It is the Holy Spirit who leads us to a clear understanding of Holy Scripture and how to proclaim the Gos-



pel in every circum-  
stance.

Remember how Cleopas, in sharing the disciples' disappointment after the crucifixion of Jesus, said, "But we trusted that it had been He which should have redeemed Israel." (*St. Luke 24:21a*, KJV). This trust, this hope, was dashed at that time. Then

is waged and how long it lasts. It is this hope that we must be ready to share with anyone who needs to find hope for the future.

Through the power of our new life in Christ, let us go forth and do so.


